1. General Information

In 1948 the C.G. Jung Institute was formed as a foundation whose goal it is to maintain and develop the concepts and methods of Analytical Psychology and to promote exchange with an interested audience.

Analytical Psychology draws on the depth psychological concept of the unconscious psyche to expand the knowledge of phenomena and development within the soul; it strives to promote the comprehension of every human being's worth and uniqueness. Jung's central concept of individuation is not meant for just a few especially apt individuals. Instead, it aims to realize individual possibilities within everyone's social system, family group and society.

Apart from training psychoanalysts, the C.G. Jung Institute also offers a variety of Further Education Programs. The Further Education Program in Analytical Psychology aims at accommodating the wishes of many people who want to familiarize themselves with Jungian Psychology and who desire to continue their education during one or two intensive semesters at the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich. It is directed at interested people from various backgrounds who see Analytical Psychology as a way of inspiring and facilitating exchange with people, of understanding the world and society and as a way to approach the soul. Theoretical and practical courses are designed to acquaint the students with fundamental knowledge of Analytical Psychology and its manner of functioning. While working intensively with dreams, with the symbolic and historical material in the seminars and by writing a seminar paper, students practice the symbolic approach from the perspective of Jungian Psychology. The Further Education Program Certificate can be attained after a minimum of two semesters and after having successfully completed a written paper and an oral exam.

We recommend regular Jungian analysis with an IAAP analyst (with at least five years of practice) alongside the Further Education Program. Based on the confrontation with one's own possibilities and limits of development within personal analysis, the participants discover the effect of Analytical Psychology on themselves, so that a personal reference to the material is ensured.

As a Further Education Program participant, one has the status of a regular student at the Institute and is permitted to attend all public lectures as well as many seminars.

The courses are held by Lecturers, Training Analysts and Supervisors of the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich, Kusnacht as well as by guest lecturers.

2. Admission Criteria

People from all educational backgrounds are considered for admission to the Further Education Program. As a formal prerequisite, a school-leaving diploma or a completed professional education are required; however no university degree is necessary.

3. Application and Admission Procedure

3.1 Application

Applicants are asked to send the following documents to the administration of studies:

- a) Application form
- b) Confirmation of a school-leaving diploma or a completed professional education.
- c) Short description of their personal and professional motives for continuing their education at the Institute (1 to 2 pages).
- d) References: Letters of recommendation from two people who know you well. Present or past personal analysts and their relations may not serve as references.
- e) Two recent photographs of the applicant.
- f) Payment receipt for the application fee of CHF 200.00
(List of fees enclosed, no refund of the application fee).

All personal information will be treated confidentially.

If you need to clarify certain questions you may make an appointment with the appropriate director of studies (in the front office at any time). As soon as all of your application documents have been received and reviewed by the director of studies, you will be informed - in writing - of your admission status.

3.2 Admission to the Further Education Program

We ask you to send in the completed registration form within the deadline. This will serve as a confirmation of your registration for the desired semester (beginning either in April or October).

Accepted students will receive the “Institute’s Code.” We ask you to comply with these rules and to send acknowledgement with your signature back to the administration of studies.

3.3 Registration

To facilitate administrative procedures, it is necessary that students register anew for each semester. The completed registration form must be at the secretariat within the registration deadline. The registration form and deadline are to be found in the booklet “Lectures and Seminars”.

3.4 Termination of studies

If no registration resp. no payment of the semester fee is made for the following semester, you will automatically be considered as exmatriculated.

4. Further Education Program Certificate

4.1 Requirements for Attaining the Certificate

The following requirements, which are summarized in the table at the end of this brochure, must be fulfilled in order to acquire the certificate.

- a) Registration as a Further Education student at the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich for a minimum of two block periods. Regular attendance is required; 60 double hours are considered a minimum. The student has to keep a record of courses attended. The lecturers must sign a booklet for this purpose, which must be handed in to the director of studies at the end of the last semester of study (record of attendance available in the front office).
- b) Writing of a 10 to 20 page seminar paper on symbolic material, drawing on the various perspectives of Analytical Psychology (fairytale, dreams, religious or culture anthropological phenomena and so forth). The essay must be accepted by one of the Institute's lecturers (examiner, trainer in theory, analyst for self experience, training analyst resp. control analyst). Its acceptance must be confirmed in the "Further Education Program Certificate."
- c) Passing of the oral exam "Fundamentals of Analytical Psychology" – (cf. reading list, rubric *Fundamentals of Analytical Psychology, Propaedeuticum*, available in the front office.)

Registration for the exam is accomplished by handing in the appropriate form to the administration of studies, accompanied by the registration fee (according to the list of fees). Further procedures are explained in the general rules concerning exams (cf. regulations i).

Both an examiner and an expert of the Institute will give the exam. The Further Education participant may choose the examiner him-/herself (a list of examiners is available in the front office).

- d) The recommended personal analysis can be confirmed by one's personal analyst in the corresponding box in the certificate.

Present or past personal analysts may not be designated to supervise papers or hold the final exam. The final must be completed at the latest by the semester following the termination of studies.

4.2 Further Education Program Certificate

After completing all of the requirements, the "Confirmation of Theoretical Knowledge in Analytical Psychology" will be signed by the director of studies as well as by the president of the Curatorium of the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich, Küsnacht.

Receipt of the "Confirmation of Theoretical Knowledge in Analytical Psychology" does not constitute permission to practice Analytical Psychology nor does it permit designating oneself as an Analytical Psychologist or Analyst in the Jungian manner. Under certain conditions and provisions a later acceptance to the training program is possible (see regulations I resp. ch). In case of later entry into the training program, parts of the work done for the "Confirmation" may be accredited through the selection committee and/or the director of studies, towards fulfilling some of the requirements of training (cf. regulations i resp. regulations ch). It is possible that other institutions may accept the "Confirmation of Theoretical Knowledge in Analytical Psychology" as part of their continuing education credit. It is however up to the student to get information about possibilities in the appropriate places.
